



Myers 5th in 440; Fochtman 7th in 220

Traverse City high school and St. Francis qualifiers in the state track finals at Ann Arbor and Mt. Pleasant ran into some stiff competition Saturday but both squads were able to make a contribution in the scoring column at the end of the two meets.

Central scored three points in the meet, that coming on Bill Myers' fifth place finish in the open 440. Bill led all the way in his heat, winning in a 51.7 time. There were five heats in this event and when it was all over, Myers was in fifth place, only five tenths of a second out of first. The winning time was 51.2 in this event.

Jim Anderson set a new school record in the broad jump and narrowly missed qualifying in the finals. He had a good jump of 22 ft. 1 1/2 in. that stood up until almost the end of the regular part of the event, then was nipped by a couple of inches to miss reaching the finals and the fight for three more jumps. He also had a 22 ft. 5 1/2 in. jump but fouled.

This marked erased the old school record, held by Jim Anderson, set in 1932, of 21 feet 7 in.

The mile relay team and Steve Swan in the highs, ran their normal times but failed to dent the scoring column.

St. Francis' lone point in the 'C' finals at Mt. Pleasant came on Vince Fochtman's seventh place in the 220 yard dash. His time, 22.5 seconds, tied the present school record.

Denny Lantner failed to reach the finals in the low hurdles in spite of the fact that he ran the distance in 21.5 seconds, which is a new St. Francis school record. The mile relay team ran the distance in 2:43.7 minutes but missed placing, as did the 550 yard relay team. Bernie Kroupa subbed for the injured Bill Mikowski in this event.

The Trojans will close the season Friday night when they compete in the LMAC meet at Grand Haven. St. Francis completed its schedule Saturday.

The Trojan inter-class meet will be held Tuesday afternoon, starting at 4:00 p.m.
