The only other new record was set by Robert Johnson of Vassar, who tossed the shot 57 feet, 5 inches to break the old mark of 55 feet, 8½ inches set by Gary Rugg of Battle Creek Penfield in 1962.

Don Witt of Whitchall set a new record in the 120-yard high hurdles with a 14.3 clocking, but the record was disallowed because of a wind factor.

Other winners were Dean Rosenberg of North Muskegon in the Day mile and Richard Tompkins of three three in the 440 yard dash.
