Star Hurt, Redford Still a Track Terror

Even without Capt. Art Link, the Huskies of Redford High served notice Tuesday they'll be a major contender Thursday when the City League's West Side track title goes up for grabs on the Redford oval.

Link was on crutches Tuesday screaming encouragement to teammates who earned 13 qualifying positions in nine events.

Last Saturday in the state championships at Ann Arbor Link ripped a muscle in his left foot and probably is through for the season.

EVEN MINUS Link, Redford managed to grab four of the 10 qualifying berths in the mile. Another Redford surprise was sophomore Dennis Smith, who turned in a 1:59.3 half mile. In the regionals 10 days ago the best Smith could do was 2:11.

Bill Patmon of Southwest-

ern was one of the busiest performers Tuesday. He qualified in both hurdles and also made the grade in the broad jump.

Wednesday Pershing will be favored to win the East Side title on its own course.
