Four Adrian Record Breaking Track Stars Enter Champion Of Champions Meet Saturday

Four record breakers in the Telegram Individual Invitational track and field championship will move into stiff competition Saturday at the Champion of Champions Invitational track meet at Waldo Stadium on the Western Michigan Uni-

versity campus in Kalamazoo.

The meet is being sponsored by the Kalamazoo Jaycees and will bring together some of the top class A and B performers in the state. Schools represented include Lansing Sexton, Battle Creek, Birmingham Sea-holm, Warren, Monroe, Lansing Everett, Pontiac Central, Dearborn, Mt. Clemens, Kalamazoo, Flint Central, Saginaw, Ann Arbor and others. Class B schools represented include state champion Willow Run and River Rouge.

The Maple performers will be shot putter Bill Gould, high jumper Rick Hunt, sprinter Kim Bauschka and broad jumper Dave Hurder. Hunt topped 6-4 in the Telegram meet, Gould threw the shot 52-6 $\frac{1}{4}$, Bauschka broke the 220 record and Harder set a new broad jump standard at 21-6 and a 440 record.

FIREBALL IMPROVING

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Race driver Glenn (Fireball) Roberts took fluids by mouth Wednesday for the first time since he was critically burned over most of his body in a fiery racing crash Sunday.

The latest medical bulletin from Charlotte's Memorial Hospital said the 33-year-old driver from Daytona Beach, Fla., was progressing satisfactorily, though his condition remained critical. He was reported still conscious and alert.
