


#### **Makes Effort for** New Speed Mark

> The English speed demon was clocked at 380 m.p.h. for his first run on Lake Eyre's salt flats and turned in a disappointing 364 m.p.h. clocking on his second run.

The record Campbell hopes New York, Terry (1-3), at Minne- to break was set in 1947 by the late John Cobb, another Englishman, who averaged 384.196 miles per hour for two runs at the Bonneville salt flats in Utah.
