

East Lansing, Sexton, Everett, Gabriels Successful

Four Greater Lansing Teams Win Track Meets Wednesday

"It gets harder to keep every year," said Sexton Track Coach Russ Mertes about his team's undefeated streak. But you can't verify his statement by the triumph over Kalamazoo at the

scores the Big Reds have been rolling up this season. Sexton has gone through 31 straight dual meets without a defeat and the Big Reds continue the streak with an 81.38 triumph over Kalamazoo at the

Big Reds' track Tuesday afternoon. However, Sexton could hit a stumbling block Thursday when it meets Ann Arbor in an away meet. The Vikings defeated the Big Reds, 25-16, for the team title at the State Journal-Spartan High School Relays early in April and Sexton would like nothing better than to avenge that loss.

Ann Arbor also was in Lansing Wednesday, defeating Farmington, 82½-26½, in a night meet at Parkview stadium. In other action, East Lansing trounced Battle Creek Lakeside, 75-34, in the Cereal City, Gabriels' stadium, Waverly, 50½-30½, at the Warriors' track, while in Jackson, Everett rolled past Parkside, 125-35½.

Charley Davis was the big man for Sexton by winning both hurdles and being first in the high jump. Sprinter Willie McKissic was once again a double winner with times of 1:10 and 21.6. The latter clocking broke the All-City 220-yard dash record but could not be counted because of a wind over the allowable limit.

Two Big Reds had outstanding marks although failing to win. Dick Shannon came within a tenth of a second of the school record when he ran 1:39.6 while taking second in the 800 and Bill Ross was runner-up in the shot put with a throw of 51 feet, 1 inch, best mark in the city this year.

At Eastern Ken Dyer won four events for Ann Arbor. He won both hurdles, the broad jump and the high jump as the Vikings' best showings were in the 440-yard dash where Barry Stevens ran a good 52.4 in second place and in the mile relay where Eastern had a 32.0 time in second place.

Another athlete to win four events was sophomore Erion Lowery of Waverly, who took both hurdles, the broad jump and the high jump against Gabriels. However, his efforts weren't enough as the Shamrocks scored their third victory of the season.

East Lansing took 19 of the 21 events in easy downing Lakeview. The Vikings swept all three places in both hurdles for their biggest point haul of the afternoon. Miler Don Stewart moved down to the half mile and ran a good 2:02.5.

Sexton set a season's best of 2:29.7 in the mile relay and, ironically, Everett posted the 3 a.m. time against Jackson Parkside. The time is the fifth fastest clocked in the state this season. The Vikings, who improved their season record to 4-1, won nine events. Henry Patton won both hurdles as usual and led off the winning 880-yard relay team while teammate Tom Smith, another relay team member, took both sprints.
