

Redford Wins Own Relay Meet

Redford High was at least half a host Saturday.

The Huskies paid tribute to Carl Holmes, the 30-year coaching veteran at Pershing High. They dedicated their Redford Relays to the East Side tutor. They made Holmes the meet's honorary referee. There were speeches and a trophy presentation.

Then coach Bruce Waha and his West Siders pulled the welcome mat out from under Pershing, winning four events, piling up 70 points and racing off with their fifth relays title in six years.

DAVE McKELVEY, Art Link and John Squiers led the Redford assault.

McKelvey anchored both the one-mile and two-mile relay teams. His :48.5-second leg on the mile relay pulled the Huskies to a 3:23.5 triumph. In the two-mile event he was clocked in 1:59 flat as Redford won handily in 8:08.5.

Link performed on both the one-mile relay and sprint medley. His half-mile leg on the sprint medley, a brilliant 1:56.3 effort, was the finest time of the day.

Squiers teamed with Bill Dean and Paul Maki to win the shot put relay. Squiers' personal contribution was a heave of 52 feet, 1-4 inch.

Pershing and Eastern, the two East Side contenders, tied for second with 56 points. Seventeen City League schools scored in the 12-event program.
