

Track Club Runners Earn Firsts

BIRMINGHAM — The Ann Arbor Track Club's John Gregg and Francie Kraker claimed first-place trophies today following competition in the U.S. Track and Field Federation Open meet at Birmingham Sea-holm High.

Gregg, a former Michigan sprinter, won the 220 in 22 while Miss Kraker sped the 440 in 00.5.

Running in the senior division (17-and-over), Gregg also placed second in the 100-yard dash in 10.3 and ran the final leg on the club's mile relay team which finished fourth in 3:37.5. Other members of the team

were Bob Lillie, Jim Burger and John Sharmet. Lillie also placed fifth in the mile with a 4:37.5 clocking and seventh in the 880 with a 2:03.5.

In the junior division (16-and-under), David Crise placed second in the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 8½ inches and Batchler and Daswell Campbell

third in the high jump with a jump of 5-10. Others placing winners. Batchler, of Miami of Ohio, won the two-mile run and fifth, high jump, 5-8), Mike Lutz (seventh, mile-run while Campbell, a freshman at Michigan State, won the century and 440.
