High School Senior Beters State Mark

HOWELL — A heave almost seven feet further than the existing state shot put record was made Saturday by Howell High School senior Cindy Jones of Lake Chemung.

Participating in Flint at the Michigan A.A.U. state championship track meet for girls, the young athlete bettered the state mark of 30 feet, 8 inches, every time she put the eight-pound ball.

Her best mark was 37 feet, six inches.

ACCORDING TO Duane Zemper, local track coach, her winning mark would have placed her in the first five in the national championships held in California two weeks ago. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Jones.

He was enthusiastic about her future. "Cindy will really go places," he said.

Almost at the six-foot mark in height, she tips the scales near the 200-pound mark.

Donna Williams, Howell's other representative at the meet, placed fourth in the 880-yard run with a time of 2:49.

This is her best time to date.

Zemper said both girls show great promise and should inspire other local girls to compete.
