

# Howell Brothers Top Open Track Meet Here

Rick and Steve Zemper, a pair of brothers from Howell, took the most honors as 150 athletes braved a rainstorm Tuesday night to compete in a U.S. Track and Field Federation track meet at Michigan State's Ralph H. Young Field.

Rick, a junior at Michigan State, won the open mile in 4:38.5 and the open two-mile in 9:55.7 besides running a leg on the winning one-mile relay team. Steve, who still attends Howell High School, also ran on the mile relay team, captured the junior mile and was second in the junior 880 with a good 2:04.8.

Others running on the Howell mile relay team were Jack Hardy and Rick Dunn. The latter runner also was second in the open 100-yard dash with a :10.7 clocking.

Everett's Henry Patino, state high school hurdles champion, lost twice to MSU freshmen. Das Campbell won the 100 in :10.5 with Patino third in :10.8, while Bob Steele posted a :14.3 over the 39-inch high hurdles as Patino placed second in :14.6. Both times were aided by too much

wind. Campbell, who is from Hazel Park, took the 440-yard dash in a fast :50.1.

to the Kansas City reliever in the fourth.

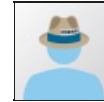
Wyatt, who said he was "real nervous" before the game, promptly showed it by being tagged for a homer by Billy Williams of the Cubs on his first pitch.

Everett's Duane Wells took second in the junior pole vault with an 11-foot, 6-inch effort while Debbie Cooper of Lansing won a section of the girls' 100-yard dash in :13.6.

The best event of the day was the high jump where two former Western Michigan University athletes, Alonzo Littlejohn and Jim Oliphant, both cleared 6 feet, 6 inches. Littlejohn was awarded the first place on fewer misses. Alonzo's brother, Del, a sophomore at Jackson High School, was third in the open event at 6 feet, 4 inches.
