

Track Records Are Shattered

Finals Slated On Thursday

A basket was the only missing item Tuesday at Dort Field. Supervisor Norbert Badar needed a basket to carry away record performances by Flint Olympian Games trackmen who dipped back as far as 1958 for their assault which created 13 marks, equaled four others and established standards in five new events.

While the over-all performance was outstanding, it became more noteworthy because this was only the preliminary to the main event Thursday afternoon. The record smashing came although most contestants were mainly interested in qualifying for the finals and the chance to represent Flint against Hamilton, Ont., in the Aug. 14-15-16 CANUSA Games.

Art Wenzlaff, a trainee in the community school program and probable successor to Nick Manych at Potter, was the outstanding individual. He tossed the javelin 171 feet, 3 inches to break the oldest record still on the books — the 167-9 effort by the late Ron Haughlie in 1958. Wenzlaff also heaved the discus 128 feet to crack the 122-7 mark by another Northern coach, Fred Crawford, in 1962.

Lavern Miller, in the 14-15 years division, tied records for the 70 high hurdles and high jump. And Sharon Walker equaled records for the 50 and 75-yard dashes in the 12-13 girls' division.

The finals will be held Thursday at Dort Field with the first event at 1 p.m.
