Cross Country Clinic

This should be especially good for coaches new to cross country as meet management and organization of practice will be two of the areas covered. It is also planned that an informal discussion by all coaches present will follow. The U. of D. High School is located on West Seven Mile about half-way between Livernois any Wyoming. Use the gym entrance.

M.I.T.C.A. has been approached to become affiliated with the Michigan High School Coaches Association. Bob James, the President, will be present at the clinic to discuss this proposal and answer any questions that the members of J.I.T.C.A. might have.

Regional Qualifications

It has been established that beginning this fall three teams instead of two will qualify from each Class A and B regional to the State Finals in cross country.

(3) it is opposed by coaches in the smaller schools (?). Take your pick! If one of these three points would make you, as a coach, oppose the two mile run than you, as an individual, should re-evaluate your entire program.

The discus was ruled out because of the danger involved. Last year a boy in Texas was killed by a discus. It seems to me there were also some death in the United States in football! Has football been dropped from the sports program in Michigan? Granted, there is danger involved, but if the discus is coached properly and a few simple safety precautions taken, it should not be so dangerous as to keep it out of the program. Michigan remains as one of only two states in the U.S. that does not have the discus in the high school track and fields program. As track coaches let's work to educate the public that these events can be handled properly by good coaches and that they should be a part of Michigan High School Track.

Just a short note to let you know how the only California member of the Michigan I.T.C.A. is doing, and to pass along an idea.

I enclose a copy of the results of our Eighth Annual Long Beach Invitational Cross Country Championships. This is the first meet of the season and is in the schedule to give the athletes something to keep running for all summer.

We have organized it to give every one a chance to run, and against people his own level, from Junior Varsity all the way to Olympic Class Runners. As you can see we had over 1,200 men run approximately 5,000 meiles during the two days of the Meet.

We had Eight Races in thenHigh School Division. Four for the Junior Varsity boys and Four for Varsity. The Schools were divided into Four races relative to the number of students in the school. Thirty Nine School attended which made about 75 in each race. We start at 3:00 pm and finish with a Fun Run at 5:00 pm This Fun Run idea comes from the fact that many teams out here have over 100 out in an attempt to make the seven man Varsity and Junior Varsity teams. As you can guess, a much greated turnout than for Football. In order to give these boys a chance to run on the same course so as to get a time we allow all who haven"t had a chance to run go in this so called Fun Run.

What a sight to see over 500 athletes lined up at the starting line for one race (this Fun Run). On Saturday we go with the colleges. Four run at the Junior College and College-Open levels followed by another Fun Run at Noon.

I will attemp to keep in contact with you throughout the season. Maybe we can help each other by this type of an exchange of ideas. I only hope you guys back there try this Fun Run, it's great.
