

Francie Kraker Is A-OK

Francie Kraker, Ann Arbor's fast-stepping 880-yard competitor, received well-done plaudits from her coaches, Mr. and Mrs. Ken Simmons, today following her first competition in the women's world of track.

"Francie did better than we expected," said Mr. Simmons following her efforts in National AAU Men's and Women's Championships held in New York

City's Madison Square Garden over the weekend.

An international field of 32 women competed in the 880 and Miss Kraker, 18, placed fourth in her preliminary heat with a time of 2:19. Her opponents included some of the best in the world. They were England's Anita Webb, Hungary's Nagy Szabo and Marie Mulder, the top half miler in the U.S. Miss Kraker's fourth-place time was faster than the first-place time in the third heat. Toronto's Abbe Huffman won the event in 2:11.8.

It was the first time the member of the Southeastern Michigammas had run the 880 this year and it was her first experience on the boards. Her teammate, Louise Gerrish, placed third in the woman's basketball throw with a toss of 99 feet 4 inches.
