

# K Of C Track Meet Is Disappointing

CLEVELAND (UPI) —Well, after being sidelined by a knee injury, they have to do better outdoors.

That about summed up the feeling after the 25th annual Knights of Columbus track meet Friday night, the final major event of the indoor season.

Among the disappointments were a 4:10 clocking by Jim Grelle that was good enough for a victory in the mile and a pole vault duel between Mel Hein Jr. and Billy Pemelton that fizzled when Pemelton was unable to clear 16 feet.

Pemelton who cleared 16-8 last month, couldn't get any higher than 15-6. Hein won by clearing 16 feet then missed in three shots at 16-6-1/2.

Grelle, the defending champion, edged Olympic hero Billy Mills by two yards in one of the slowest miles of the indoor season.

Bob Schul, the Olympic 5,000 meter champion, also had a poor showing as he finished dead last in the three-mile run. However, Schul was making his first start of the indoor season.

The ladies produced the only major meet records as Iolanda Balas of Romania cleared 5-10-1/2 in winning the women's high jump and Abby Hoffman of Toronto won the women's 880 yard run with a clocking of 2:12.
