years, such as Willie Betts and Boice Bowman, but the Pan-thers of coach Roy Krueger do have depth and that was enough to easily win the team title at Bowen Fieldhouse on the Eastern Michigan Univer-sity campus sity campus.

It's also depth that makes the Panthers the strong early favorite to repeat as Class B team champion in The State Journal-Spartan Relays Friday at Jenison.

River Rouge scored 41 points to win its first Huron Relays title since 1963. The Panthers were far down in the standings last year but there was a sim-ple reason for it. The state basketball finals were held the same day as the Huron Relays

last season and basketball players form the nucleus of most Panther track teams. Several of the basketball players who helped Rouge to victory last Saturday also were prominent here as Sam Campbell, Rolando Shorey and Al Taliaferro contributed key points points

A Canadian school, Kennedy Collegiate of Windsor, was sec-ond with 32 points while the best area showing was turned in by Haslett, which took 10th with 11 points. Howell was right behind by tying for 12th with 8 points.

Rouge won two events, the broad jump relay and the shuttle hurdles relay, and also took two seconds and two

fourths. The best Panther show-ing was in the shuttle hurdles where they tied the meet recing was in the shuttle hurdles ord with a :29.8.


