

Glove King a Hit As Trackman, Too

Al Jones, Western High's national Golden Gloves boxing champion, is also giving the Cowboys quite a lift this spring in track.

Western finished fifth last season on the West Side, but if Jones and Reggie Soares continue to click, coach Bill Rankin's team is certain of a higher finish in 1965.

Jones won the broad jump, pole vault and 440 Wednesday and Soares captured both the 100 and 220 as the Cowboys romped past Cooley, 88½-20½, winning all 13 first places. Soares' times of :10.1 in the 100 and :21.9 in the 220 were considered exceptional for this time of year.
