**Battle Creek Takes Title**

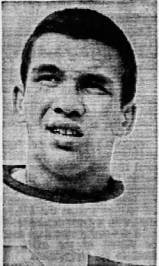
## Everett Upset in Hast

HASTINGS — Defending state champion Battle Creek Central, paced by state sprint king Arnie Williams, upset Everett here Saturday in the Vikings bid for a third straight team title at the Hastings Relays.

Battle Creek's Bearcats scored 58 points while Everett was a close second with 54. Kalamazoo Loy Norri was third at 45 followed by the Eastern Quackers with 31. Charlotte took eighth with five points.

Williams paced Battle Creek by anchoring the winning 440 and 880-yard relay teams to victory. Everett scored three firsts while Eastern and Charlotte each had one.

**PREPS OF WEEK** — John Wintermute, Haslett senior, set an area quarter-mile record last week when he was clocked at 3:52.9 in a triangular meet. Wintermute's performance placed him first among area quarter-milers and earned him Prep of Week honors. John is also a member of Haslett's mile relay team which has run 3:37.9 so far, also tops in the area. Mason's Ron Reynolds, also a senior, earned prep honors for his golf performance last week. Ron started off the week on Monday with par 37 against Gabriels, and fired par 36's against Jackson St. John and Eaton Rapids later in the week. His fine play has been instrumental in leading Mason to a 6-0 record in the Capital Circuit.

Other Viking victories were taken by Fred Schnarr in the pole vault and by Russ Barnes in the high hurdles. Everett also took second in the distance medley and 880 relays and third in the 440 and two-mile relays.

Eastern's victory came in the distance medley relay where the foursome of Barry Stevens, Keith Lucas, Ed Bentley and Daryl Burt clocked 11:03.0.

The Quakers' Bob Bowers took second in the high jump and third in the high hurdles while Jeff Hath was third in the long jump.

The Quakers also picked up a second in the sprint medley relay with the team of Stevens, Yolyn Hollingsworth, Lindsey Beard and Bruce Marshall. Eastern also was fifth in the 880 relay while Roger Burgess accounted for the rest of the Quakers scoring with a fifth in the shot put.
