# Fenton's Hajec Is Double Victor For Ball State

MUNCIE, Ind.—It's double or nothing for Fenton's Bill Hejec.

Recently the righthanded Ball State College pitcher was tagged with a double loss in a twin bill. Saturday he won twice as the Cardinals defeated Butler, 5-4 in 12 innings, and 5-1.

In the opener Hajec, who has allowed only two earned runs in 39½ innings of Indiana Collegiate Conference hurling, tossed hitless ball the final three innings to gain his seventh victory in nine decisions. He fanned five, walked two and singled.

In the nightcap Hajec went the distance, allowing two hits (one a homer) while striking out nine and passing two for his eighth triumph.

Hajec also got two hits in three cracks and had help from former Flint Northern athlete Pat Manley whose three-for-three effort included two doubles.

Former Flint Holy Redeemer star Wayne Schmitz went six and two-third innings in the opener, allowing four runs. Ball State won on Charles Nugent's homer in the lower 12th.

Ball State, coached by former Flint Central mentor Ray Louthen, is 14-5 overall with an ICC leading 8-2 log.



# Swartz Creek, Davison Reign

Davison High as the host girls' track team Saturday used depth enough to win the Big Nine championship while Swartz Creek placed in every event in topping four County B League foes.

Davison won only three events but made up the difference by placing 1-2-4 in the 220 and 2-3 in the 100 to win with 55½ points to defending champ Flushing's 41.

Sandy Briggs led Swartz Creek, winning the 100 and 440. Swartz Creek earned 75 points in leading thoroughout. Bendle finished with 51 points, Lakeville earned 33, defending champion Atherton 29 and Bentley 7.

The Creeker lasses overpowered the field, placing 1-2 in the 220, 2-3-4 in the 70 yard hurdles and 1-3-5 in the 440.

Atherton's Sue Potter successfully defended her softball title but fell to Bendle's Jan Cote in the shot put. Miss Cote has a possible state mark under investigation.

Lakeville's Jane Keller (sophomore) was the big point getter in a losing role, winning the 100 and standing long jump and high jump for 15 points.

"I think she's another Kitty Beach," said Lakeville coach Lorna Dyché. Miss Beach held two girls' records until Saturday.

"The girls have been wonderful to work with," said Swartz Creek Coach Marjorie Wilcox. The Creekers were champions in 1962.

Although Swartz Creek's depth was overwhelming, it failed to set any records. Jane Keller set a 100 dash mark for Lakeville with a 12.3 race while Bendle's Vicki Baker set a 70-yard hurdes record in 11.5.

The Atherton relay team of Dianne Rodabaugh, Janis Richmond, sister Marilyn and Linda Nerychek clipped three-tenths of a second from the 440 relay

mark with a 56.7 time. Mt. Morris had 34 points, Ainsworth 27 and Kearsley 15½. Jennie Bigelow led Mt. Morris, winning the running long jump, tying with Kay Forest (Davison) for fifth in the standing long jump and running on the 440 relay.
