

State Vault Mark Is Set By S. Papes

The Free Soil Pirates made their finest track showing in history, Saturday, as they finished third in the class D state meet run at Mt. Pleasant.

Added to their high finish, the Pirates won two first places, set a state record, five school records and one county mark.

Covert won the class D title with 38 points and Lake City was second with 36 points. Free

Ludington established two new county records, Saturday, in the class B state track meet run at Ann Arbor.

The Orioles failed to score any points but set new Mason County marks for the 880-yard relay and the mile relay.

In the 880-yard relay, the team of Hiroshi Yano, Ken Piszczek, Jim Jensen and Jim Fay turned in a time of 1:35.2 to erase the mark they set in the conference meet last week.

The mile relay team of Dan Genter, Fred Engle, Dan Peterson and Mitch Newberg ran a 3:32.2 for a new county mark. Mason County Eastern held the old mark at 3:39.8 set in 1962.

Soil and Gross Pointe University High each had 27 points for third place.

Steve Papes set a new class D pole vault record by clearing 12'. The old mark was set in 1961 by Gary Tesman of Centerville at 11'10".

Calvin Young won the shot put for the Pirates by getting off a put of 32'1" to set a new school and county record. Young also took seventh in the high hurdles and eighth in the lows.

Mike Campbell was fifth in the high jump at 5'9".

The mile relay team of Maurice Campbell, Frank Surma, Stan Gajski and Miskey McIntosh, set a school mark at 3:39.6 and finished seventh.

Young's time in the highs was :16.5 and in the lows he was clocked in :22.0.
