

JOHNSON SETS PUT MARK

Panthers Dominate Class B

ANN ARBOR (AP) — River Rouge dominated the entire afternoon and captured the Michigan Class B High School track title at the University of Michigan's Ferry Field Saturday. The Panthers won both relays, had two individual champions and earned 61 points, far more than their nearest competition. Willow Run placed second with 26 points, two more than Albion and Vassar tied for fourth with 21 points each. Three records were shattered in the meet. In the mile relay, the quartet of Jim Miller of Sturgis cleared the bar at 6-feet-5 to eclipse the old high jump record of 6-2 1/2 set in 1960 by Jerry Holmes of Ecorse.

dash, running :10.5 into a stiff wind. River Rouge's other individual champion was Peterson, who was clocked in :50.2 in the 400-yard dash. Albion's Pat Howard won the broad jump title with a leap of 21-7 1/4. Steve Bishop of Vicksburg led most of the way to win the mile run in 4:22.8. The pole vault sent the meet into overtime when 17 entrants cleared the bar at 12 feet. The meet, for the first time, was scored through eight places for all events except the relays, in which points were awarded through ten places.

Boros Scores To Retain

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Julius Boros had to adopt a gambling, scrambling game on Saturday after he lost his magic touch but still managed to shoot a 71 to hold on to a one-stroke lead after three rounds of the \$60,000 Memphis Open Golf tournament. Boros approached the 18th green in a tie for the lead but sank a four-foot birdie putt to take sole control of the No. 1 spot with a 54-hole score of 201. Boros, who started the day four strokes ahead of the field, will go into Sunday's final round just one stroke up on Bob McCallister of Corona, Calif., who shot a 66 for a total of 202. Tied for third place were young Johnny Potts, who shot 11 his second straight 67 for a 203 and former U. S. Open champion Gene Littler, who came in with a 69 for his 203.
