Northwestern Junior High Captures City Track Title

Northwestern Junior High flexed its track muscles on C. W. Post Field yesterday, on a cold, windy afternoon, to capture the 1965 city junior high track and field championship on 151 points. Coach Al Leiber's talented NW squad amassed the most points in all three classes in rushing to its clear-cut overall team title. George Maggett paced Northwestern on two record-shattering victories. Maggett set a new 100 yard low hurdles record of 12.1 seconds in Class 6 and also a new record of 19 ft., 9 1/2 ins., in the long jump. Dave Statter helped the NW cause by winning the Class 2 long jump on a new record of 17 ft., 10 1/2 ins., and running on the 400 yard relay that set a record of 29.6. Other record-breaking performances were turned in by Steve Nelson of NW in the Class 5 shot put; Jeff Rogers of NW in the Class 4 high jump; and Charles Knox of NW in the Class 6 high jump. Elijah Glass of NW tied the Class 2 high jump record and SW tied the Class 4 400 yard relay standard.
