

JAYS TOP WATERFORD

Area Thinclads Face County Meet

Track and field teams from Southfield and Groves high schools will be in action tomorrow evening at Hazel Park, in quest of the Oakland county championship.

Groves, with good balance and exceptional depth in the hurdle events, is conceded a chance of taking the title.

Southfield, improving with every meet, could be a surprise contender.

The Falcons of Groves got in a warmup last week, overpowering John Glenn High for their ninth consecutive dual meet victory of the season.

The Jays, who competed last evening in the Southeastern Michigan league meet at Southfield, made their dual meet record 6-2 last week, with a 63-46 victory over Waterford.

THE winners were paced by a pair of record-setting performances by pole vaulter Bob Maurer and hurdler Dave Warford.

Maurer cracked his own school mark by clearing 12 - feet, 10 - inches in the vault, and Warford bettered the school record he had shared with teammate Dave Eastin by winning the 180 - yard low hurdles in 20.7 - seconds.

The Jays won eight of the 13 events to top Waterford, registering a surprise in one.

The surprise came in the 880, where Jays Kim Hartman and Ralph Roscoe, neither of whom had competed in the event before, finished one - two. Hartman was the winner in 2:00.3, Roscoe chasing him in 2:04.

Roscoe added a first place in the broad jump, spanning 20 - feet, 6 - inches, and both Hartman and Roscoe combined with Tom Hetes and Marc Goldstein to win the mile relay.

THREE other Jay winners were Skip Fournier, with a 52 - foot, 11-1/2 inch shot put, Jim Burgess, at 5 - feet, 8 - inches in the high jump, and Dave Eastin in the 120 - yard high hurdles at 15.7-seconds.

Following Friday's
