

U-D High Trackmen Win Title in a 'Photo'

A third-place finish in the mile relay, final event on a cold and windswept day, brought U-D High a Catholic League First Division track title Saturday at Henry Ford High.

The Cubs barely nipped front-running Catholic Central, 35-34, the defending champion, in a four-team race which found Brother Rice finishing third and DeLaSalle fourth.

It was a virtual sweep for the Central League, the all-boys' schools in the sprawling parochial league. The Central League not only finished 1-2-3-4 but won nine of the 13 first places.

SHRINE, one of the parish

schools, produced the day's only double winner.

Jim Seymour, winding up a fabled career for the Knights, won both hurdles and set a record of :19.6 in the 180-yard hurdles.

Seymour, brother of the Army's fine football halfback, John Seymour, has been one of the state premier hurdlers all spring and many are predicting a brilliant collegiate future for this youngster.

Paul Walrad of DeLaSalle and Tom Rabaut of Austin accounted for the day's only other records.

Refusing to yield to either the wind or the cold, Walrad vaulted 12 feet 10 inches for his record. Rabaut easily bettered his own time of :51.6 by

winning the 440-yard dash in :50.9.

Although he barely missed his record, Steve Assenmacher of Divine Child stepped a lively 4:29.1 mile for another excellent performance. The summaries:
