FEDERATION SPECTACULAR

Holland Flies 26-2 1/2 To Win Long Jump

Western Michigan's Dennis Holland got off the second best long jump in the world this year to steal the show in the Michigan Federation track and field championships Saturday afternoon at Waldo Stadium. Holland, on his final competitive jump here in a brilliant career soared 26 feet, two and one-half inches for a mark bettered this year only by New Mexico's Clarence Robinson, who went 26-9 earlier in the season.

Although Holland's mark was a Western varsity mark, it was one-half inch short of the stadium mark set in 1958 by Indiana's Olympic gold medal winner Greg Bell

The spectacular long jump—nearly two feet ahead of meet runnerup and Big Ten champion Jim Garrett of Michigan State—highlighted a day of record-breaking by federation competitors.

Seven new federation records were broken and two more equaled on a cool and breezy afternoon before some 1,000 fans.

Most impressive efforts, in addition to Holland's, were Garrett's :09.6 in the 100-yard dash, a discus throw of 185 feet, one and one-half inches by former Michigan star Ernst Soudek, a 1:50.8 half-mile by Western's

Ralph Stephenson, who also ran a :47.2 quarter-mile leg in the mile relay and a 14-flat clocking in the 120-yard high hurdles by Michigan State's football end Gene Washington

Jim Vogler ran the 440-yard intermediate hurdles in :53.7 and Michigan State won the 440-yard relay in 42 seconds flat for record-tying efforts.

Former Bronco Mickey Turcheck, competing unattached, cleared 15 feet, five inches in winning the pole vault for the finest effort of his career.
