

City League Track Romp For Eastern

Eastern High had both the individual talent and the overall balance Thursday to win its second City League track title in four years.

On a sunlit day, under almost perfect conditions, the Indians rolled over 19 other rivals at Pershing High to amass 78 points and runaway from a field which was left to fight it out for second place.

WALTER DAVIS and Stan Allen were the big guns for Eastern. Here were a couple of go-go kids.

Davis won the pole vault and low hurdles and placed second in the highs. Allen won the high jump with a leap of 6-feet-5 and placed second to Chadsey's Maurice Cochran in the long jump. Together Davis and Allen accounted for 46 of Eastern's 78 points.

But coach Lorenzo Wright got good distance out of his balanced squad scoring in nine of the 13 events.

Northwestern outdueled Pershing, Redford and Chadsey in the battle for second place narrowly beating Pershing for second by one third of a point, 46 $\frac{2}{3}$ -46 $\frac{1}{3}$.

Although he missed his coveted record, Brian Moore, the state champion miler from Cass Tech, turned in a brilliant 4:16.2 effort, just four seconds off Lou Scott's league and state mark.

MOORE OPENED with a sizzling one-minute first quarter and turned the half-mile in 2:05. The pace proved too difficult as he came home the final half in 2:11.2.

Allen, too, had dreams of shattering the high jump record of 6-6 but couldn't make it. He's been bothered for two weeks with a sore hip.
