Indians Rule Track Semis

Outsiders in Thursday's City League track finals had their fun Tuesday at Pershing High in semifinal qualifying heats of the 43rd annual championships.

Northwestern and Pershing smashed relay records, but barring an unforeseen catastrophe, it will be an Eastern High show in the finals.

There was qualifying in 11 of the 13 events Monday and coach Lorenzo Wright's Eastern squad grabbed nine individual spots and placed both its relays.

REDFORD, scoring heavily in the 880-mile and shot put, grabbed seven qualifying spots in addition to its mile relay.

There simply are no genuine challengers for the Indians.

After Northwestern's crack 880-yard quartet of Roger Addison, John Hawkins, Jim Kimble and Chubert Jeffries sped to a record 1:27.8 in the day's opening running event, Pershing closed out the qualifying with its own surprise.

Nick Chomas of Southeastern scratched his quartermilers from the 440 to load the mile relay and preserve the Jungaleers' prestige as staking of the event. But it didn't work.
