Female Track Stars to Invade Flint

Anyone doubtful of the increased emphasis on girls' track in Michigan can get an object lesson on Saturday.

The Flint Track Club expects more than 200 contestants at Dort Field for the fifth annual Michigan Amateur Athletic Union Women's Championships.

If 210 appear, they'll constitute a 500 per cent increase in only two years. That should suffice for evidence that more and more girls and women are competing in track.

WHEN THE FTC got the meet underway in 1961, only a handful of runners appeared and many of those were "imports" from Cleveland. As late as two years ago only 35 entered.

A year ago the entry jumped to 96. Meet Director Norbert Bardar is confident that at least 200 will be on hand Saturday. More than that number competed in a warmup meet last Saturday at

Utica.

The major portion of the entries is expected to be from the Flint area. But a large group is working out in Detroit where former hurdling great Hayes Jones is coach and Ann Arbor has a big group.

TWO OF THE biggest stars

Louise Gerrish last week threw the javelin 155 feet for a national record and teammate Francine Kraker is a former national junior champion in the 880-yard run.

Girls are in 15-and-under and 16-and-over divisions. Junior are Ann Arbor representatives. events include the high jump,

long jump, shot put, javelin, 80-meter hurdles, 50, 100 and 220-yard dashes and 440-yard relay. Senior events include all Junior events except the 50 plus discus. Also on the schedule are open events in the 440 and 880-yard runs.

Post entries will be accepted until noon. Field events and preliminaries start at 1. Finals in running events begin at 2:30.

For the first time, a team championship trophy will be awarded. A panel of coaches also will select outstanding performers in Junior and Senior divisions. The Potter School Men's Club is donating trophies.
