

Distaff Runners Set 9 Marks

Nine broken records and two records equaled in 19 events are ample evidence of the improvement in Michigan women's track.

A record field of 128 rewrote the record book Saturday at Dort Field in the sixth annual Michigan Amateur Athletic Union championships.

Eight marks were shattered and two equaled among 11 events in the Senior-Open Division where Ann Arbor's brilliant Francine Kraker was voted the most outstanding performer. A former national junior champion, Miss Kraker clipped 11.4 seconds off her 880-yard record

in 2:14.9 and ripped 1.2 seconds off her 440 record in 58.4.

Paula Love of the Flint Track Club claimed a record in the javelin with a toss of 92-5/8, breaking the mark of 86-13/8 set in 1962 by a Flint girl, Diana Slagor.

Gail Thomas won the Junior high jump at 4-6 and Colleen Jenkins pitched the javelin 70-2 1/4 for other Flint firsts.

Annette Stokes of Detroit won the 50, 100 and 220-yard dashes to be voted the outstanding Junior performer.

The Flint Track Club totaled 29 points for a poor third behind the Detroit Track Club's 114 points which nipped Ann Arbor's Southwestern Michigammas, at 106.
