# Pennel Has To Settle For Cardigan Sweater

DETROIT — John Pennel nearly went home from Cobo Arena with the world indoor pole vault record but instead had to settle for a green cardigan sweater

The sweater was Pennel's award for winning the vault at 16 feet in the Motor City International track meet last night. But it plainly was small consolation to the man who last week raised the American indoor mark to 16 feet 7 1/4 inches at San Francisco.

Last night, he sprinted down Cobo's elevated board runway and had inches to spare over his first try at 16 feet 9 1/4 inches — a new world best. Pennel's pole fell forward into the landing pit, however, disqualifying the effort. His final two tries at the height were not close.

While Pennel, competing unattached from Miami, Fla., missed his shot at a record, one women's indoor mark was set and another tied in a meet which boasted nine Olympic medalists.

Wyomia Tyus, the Olympic 100-meter champion from Tennessee A & I, clipped a tenth off the women's indoor record by running :06.7 in a heat of the 60-yard dash. She timed :06.9 in the final, besting Willye White of Mayor Daley's Youth Foundation and Edith McGuire, Olympic 200-meter champ

from Tennessee A & I. The women's 880-yard run was won comfortably in a record-tying 2:10.5 by England's Ann Smith, an Olympic finalist at 800 meters.

Close behind Miss Smith were two relative newcomers, Roberta Picco of Toronto and Francie Kraker of Ann Arbor. Miss Picco, representing the Don Mills Track and Field

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP) — The youth movement was in full swing today in the \$40,000 San Diego Open Golf tournament as a pair of 26-year-old professionals, newcomers to prominence, Paul Bondeson and Chris Blocker, ran 1-2 into the third round.
