



MANSFIELD, Ohio (AP) — Pontiac Central's Bill Tipton whipped through the 120-yard high hurdles in 14 seconds flat at the Mansfield Relays Saturday, wiping a couple of prominent names from the record books.

Tipton's mark was threetenths of a second faster than the mark of 14.3 set in 1959 by Rex Cawley of Farmington and tied by Clint Jones of Cleveland's Cathedral Latin High in 1963. Cawley was a member of the U.S. Olympic team at Tokyo in 1964. Jones now is a halfback on the Big Ten champion Michigan State football team.

Ron Strang of Detroit Luthes ran West took the mile in 4:21.
Roseville's Ivan Scholl was third in 4:21.8.

Hazel Park's four-mile relay team finished third in 18:26.
