TROPHIES AND MEDALS

A rotating Mansfield Relay Trophy will be awarded the team compiling the most points. This is a 36-inch trophy.

A beautiful trophy will be awarded the team making the most points in their field events.

A beautiful trophy will be presented to the team making the most points in the track events. This does not include relays.

Trophies will be awarded the first ten teams in the scoring. These are 20 inch trophies.

A beautiful 20 inch trophy will be given the winners of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of Fourth Place.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winner of fifth place.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

For Coaches and Athletes

Additional bleachers are being set up on north of field for athletes to relieve the congestion in the infield.

There will be an area in the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field and bleachers. Slag walks will be installed so the mud should be no factor in case of rain.

Also the pole vault pit, in use for the finals, will be at the end of the field to make for better viewing. (Foam rubber will be used in pole vault and high jump pits.)

And there will be a scoreboard for the running score.

The Mansfield Relays committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 35th renewal of the Mansfield Relays which will be staged April 15—16, 1966. "America's largest independent inter-scholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's new track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1966 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1965 meet, all-time records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The Relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1955 renewal drew 199 high schools from three states — Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Canada. Fortynine of the schools were from outside Ohio. The field numbered 2,271 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction — The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Entry Fee — Fifty cents a boy or \$10.00 a team.

Deadline for Entries — April 7, 1966.

Lodging — Accommodation for teams coming 135 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 15th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all four mile relay teams. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return home.

New Track — We have a new all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. The track cost us \$60,000. It has ten 42" in lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and broad jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface.

Only spikes not exceeding one-fourth inch may be worn on the asphalt surfaces. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubber indoor shoes that is his privilege. The athletes' shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

Shot putters and discus throwers must wear rubber soled shoes due to the fact that the areas are cement.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility — All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

Heat Leaders — Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

Classification — There is no classification.

Points — Five places will count and the scoring will be as follows — 6-4-3-2-1.

Lunch — Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for a nominal sum. Make the number of reservations you want for lunch on your numerical list.

RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, and Canada. Indiana schools will compete for the first time.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards. This idea was presented to over 100 coaches, representing participating schools. The following standards are a composite of their replies.

Individuals entered by you must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - All events will be run off on schedule. Starters in every event must be at the starting line ready to run five minutes before the scheduled time of the event.

Preliminaries-Preliminaries will be conducted in every event except the mile, 440 yd. run, two mile relay, 4 mile relay, 880 yd. relay, Medley relay, 880 yd. run, shuttle relay, mile relay will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 880 yd. relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 11 ft., 3 in. and in the high jump at 5 ft., 9 in. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the time scheduled for the event to start. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitors trial or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile run cannot take part in more than one other as track event. No boy cannot compete in more than three track events. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 49 feet will be measured.

Discus - Only throws of over 130 feet will be measured.

Broad Jump - Only jumps over 20 feet will be measured.

BIGGER AND BETTER

"It's the fastest track I've ever run on."

"The track is so soft and springy, it's like you are floating instead of running."

Those are two of the many complimentary comments made about the phenomenal rubber-asphalt track at Mehock Field in Mansfield, home of the Mansfield Relays.

They were unsolicited because prompting was not necessary. Records have fallen like magic on the two-year-old track. Eight were shattered in the 1964 Relays and last year nine more were broken. In addition, some all-time Ohio marks have been established at the Malabar High layout.

The track is 35 feet wide with 10 wide lanes that give sprinters and hurdlers plenty of elbow room. Other facilities include two rings each for shot and discus, two high jump pits and three pits each for the pole vault and board jump.

Seating facilities are abundant; more than 4,500 can now be handled with ease.

Performances by high school boys who have not been able to run extensively indoors are usually not too impressive in mid-April, but the past two years have been exceptions to the rule in the Mansfield Relays.

Almost perfect weather has prevailed and the athletes have responded amazingly.

Last year the mile went in 4:19.6, the 880 in 1:55.1, the 440 in 48.7 and the high jump in 6-7.

Those are mid-season marks by any standards. You'll see more on April 16!
