## Litchfield, Athens Win Track Battles

Defending Little C Conference track and field champion Litchfield beat Quincy in a dual meet in Bronson yesterday, 71-38, and Athens topped Homer at Union City, 49-50, in key meets.

In the other dual tests, Bronson knocked off Reading at home, 76 1/2 to 31 1/2, and Union City whipped Jonesville at home, 72-36.

Ray Miller of Quincy switched from the sprints to the 440 and set a new school record by winning in 52.7 seconds. Litchfield got a new school mark when it took the mile relay in 3:29.2. Jim Smith paced Litchfield on victories in the 100 and 200 sprints. Teammate Mike Bills took the 800 in 2:05.8.

Athens captured five events and tied for another in smacking past Homer in the tightest test of the day. There were no double winners. Lloyd Hargus of Athens won the 800 in 2:08.6 and teammate Jim Voss took the 100 sprint in 23.3 for the best times.

Union City won 10 events in beating Jonesville with Doug Miller entering a double winner for the Maroons by taking the long jump and high jump.
