# Top Performer Back In Girls' Track

"She's only a junior, thank heavens," said Lakeville High girls' Coach Lorna Kelly.

Mrs. Kelly, president of the Genesee County Women's Coaching Association, was speaking of her outstanding all-around athlete Rita Keller.

Lakeville is hoping Miss Keller can help improve its 1965 third-place finish when the County B League and Big Nine Conference teams get together for the County meet Saturday at Davison.

**MISS KELLER** was the outstanding individual performer as a sophomore when she won the 75-yard dash, standing long jump and high jump.

Swartz Creek's depth enabled it to pile up 75 points to runner-up Bendle's 51. Davison won

the Big Nine championship with 55½ points ahead of Flushing's 41.

Other outstanding performers include Atherton's Sue Potter in the shot put and softball throw, Jackie Coleman of Bendle in the distance, teammate Jan Cote in the softball throw and Flushing's hurdler Gale Crawford.

Miss Potter holds two throwing records. She threw the eight-pound shot put 32-6½ for one mark and tossed the softball 210-10 in the regional meet.

Her softball throw broke a county record that had stood since 1941.

**SHIRLEY WELLS** of Bentley is director of the meet which begins at 9 a.m. and will offer trophies to the winning team and relay winners and medals to individual winners.

Miss Keller leads a young Lakeville team which lists only two seniors.

She was most valuable on the Falcon girls' basketball team and holds county records in the standing long jump (8-5½) and 75 dash (12.25). She will not compete in the high jump this year but will run on the relay team.

Teams from the Big Nine include Davison, Kearsley, Mt. Morris, Ainsworth and Flushing and from the County B League, Lakeville, Montrose, Bendle, Fenton, Atherton, Bentley and Swartz Creek.

Girls aren't allowed to run further than 440 yards, substitute a 75-yard dash for the 100 and run a 300-yard relay. The only change in this year's 12-event meet came with the dropping of the shuttle hurdle relay.
