# New Haven, Unionville Dominate Regionals

New Haven in Class C and Unionville in Class D were Blue Water Area winners in State Regional Track Meets Saturday.

Port Huron High's Big Reds finished in 12th place in the Class A regional at Madison Heights with 12 points, trailing Mt. Clemens (36), and Roseville (32).

Jerry Nichols of Port Huron won the high jump with a leap of 5-feet, 10-inches, and he placed third in the long jump, qualifying for the state finals in both events.

Port Huron's Gerry Noble placed third in the high jump, and fourth in the 100-yard dash, while Ed Distelrath was fifth in the low hurdles.

Port Huron Northern failed to score any points in the regional.

Rich Chenault and Gordie Lee paced New Haven's win at Birmingham with three firsts each. Chenault won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and the long jump and Lee posted wins in the high and low hurdles and the high jump.

Almont finished seventh with seven points and Richmond eleventh with three points at Birmingham.

At Cass City Unionville ran away from its Class D competition with four firsts, four seconds and five thirds for 64½ points. North Huron finished with 27 points for fourth, followed by Kingston with 26, Carsonville 8, Port Hope 6, Peck 5, Caseville 4, Owen-Gage 3.

In Class B action at Cass City, Caro finished second to Bridgeport with 31 points, Cros-Lex was third with 24. Other area schools were Vassar with 14, Cass City 12, Imlay City 5, Elkton-Pigeon-Bayport 4, Millington 3½, Sandusky 3 and Bad Axe, 2.

Port Huron Catholic with 27½ points finished second and Marysville with 22 third in Class B regionals at Madison Heights. Avondale finished first with 38 points. Other area schools were seventh place Marine City with 15½ points, Anchor Bay 9, and St. Clair 6. Algonac failed to score.

## Record Number Of Hunters Bagged 113,000 Deer

LANING (AP)—A final estimate shows Michigan's deer hunters bagged 113,000 White-tails last year, says the State Conservation Department.

The department claims this is still a respectable figure, despite the drop from the 141,000 taken the previous season.

It was only the fifth year Michigan's firearm deer harvest has gone over the 100,000 mark.

deer take dropped to 49,630 from 54,420 the previous year.

Hunter numbers were the largest on record with 592,000 in the field. About one out of every five bagged a deer. The previous year, when some 43,000 fewer active hunters were out, one out of four was successful.

The department said although the deer kill dropped only about 28,000 from the year before the increase in hunters meant there
