THIS WAS the unexpected performance which the Colts needed so badly when they ran into trouble in the preliminaries. Miller, clearly their best low hurdler, failed to qualify and Bosh, their top sprinter, didn't qualify in the 220.

Childress leaped 22-11/4 on his first effort which seemed to signal that it was Southwestern's day. Moments later Yancey heaved the shot 59-1/4 on his first try. Then Miller atoned for his hurdles lapse with a 22-10/4 long jump.

That set the small crowd at University of Michigan's Ferry Field abuzzing. But they really buzzed moments later when Bosh got the baton on the final leg of the 880 relay and rallied in the final 20 yards to nip Ypsilanti for first place in 1:30.3. That 10 points, added to the Childress - Yancey - Miller efforts, clearly stamped Southwestern as the team to watch.

ALL THIS came within five minutes. Except for Daryl Smith's eighth place in the 100 and a seven-point pickup by Childress and Miller (seventh) in the low hurdles, it was the extent of Southwestern's points. But it was enough to erase the

equalling jaunt by Detroit MacKenzie's Charlie Robinson who also set a record of 21.5 in the 200 run around a curve.

Northwestern's Lindy Wright won his 440 heat in 49.6 but was fifth in the over-all standings.

Ainsworth Jack Magelssen was advanced to eighth place in the mile because of three disqualifications and joined Mark Schmier, Rex Smith and Mike Kreutziger in getting 10th place in the mile

GARDEN CITY, Kan. — A strong finish by Flint Junior College's Larry Page earned a National Junior College record Saturday.

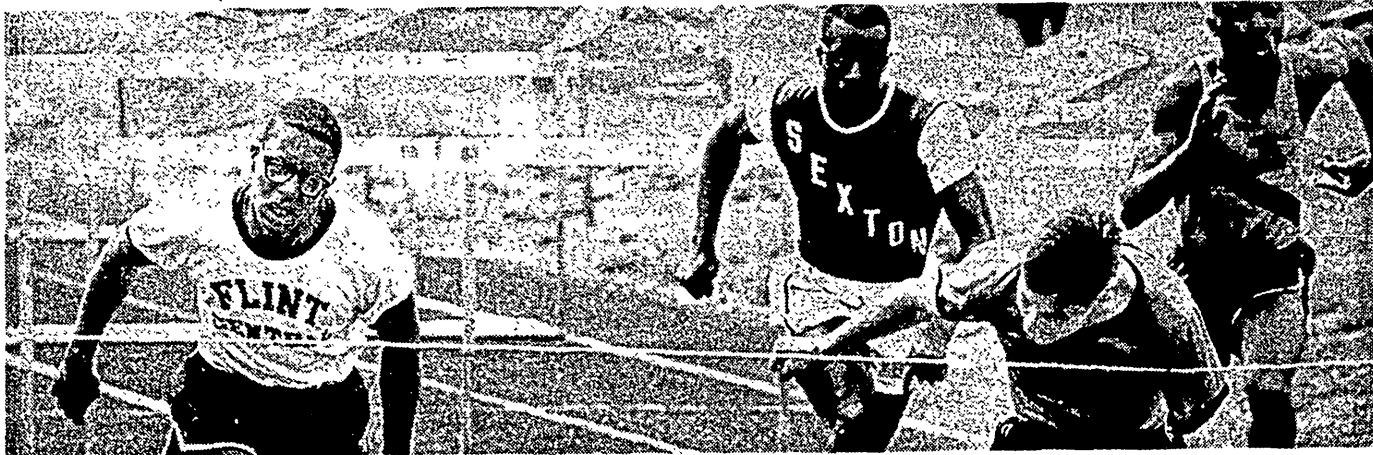
Page ran a 55-second first quarter, then picked it up off the last curve and passed Grand Rapids Junior College's Jim Larson in national record 880 time of 1:52.7.

Larson, a Page victim in the Michigan Junior College meet, also broke the 1:53.3 standard set by Arthur Rodriguez of San Antonio, Tex., in 1965 when he ran the distance in 1:53.

Ed Carr set a Flint record when he ran the 330-yard intermediate hurdles in 38.5 seconds but placed fifth in the meet. The Bear's mile relay team was seventh despite a 49-second quarter by Roger Addison. Kent Hall failed to qualify in the pole vault.

Six-Run Fourth Aids McLain to 7th Win

BALTIMORE (AP) — The Northrup pulled a double steal Detroit Tigers scored six runs in the fourth inning, three on a homer by Don Demeter, and defeated the Baltimore Orioles 7-5 Saturday night behind the four-hit pitching of Denny McLain. The game was called because of rain in the last half of the ninth.

The Tigers opened the scoring in the first inning on singles by Dick McAuliffe and Jerry Lumpe Boog Powell's error and an infield out.

Gates Brown was ejected from the game for disputing a called third strike which ended the inning.
