Covert Repeats in 'D' Track

MOUNT PLEASANT (AP)—Covert captured his third straight Michigan High School Class D track championship Saturday afternoon to complete a highly successful year in prep athletic competition.

Covert, who won the Class D basketball title in March, scored in 11 events to amass 59-4/5 points and retain its crown.

Kalamazoo University High had 50 points for runner-up honors while Ann Arbor U. High had 48-3/5 for third.

Three records were set in the meet, held at the Central Michigan University track, with 46 teams earning points.

Bernie Woods was a double winner for Covert's 10-man team, while teammate Clarence Baber set a record in the 180-yard low hurdles.

Woods captured the 440-yard dash in :51.9 and shared first place in the pole vault at 11-10 with three others.

Baber skimmed over the hurdles in :20.2 seconds to better the old record by one-tenth of a second.

Jim Pegg of Martin, who holds the 880-yard record, established a mark of 4:30.8 in the mile for another state record in the class.

The other meet record was set by Kalamazoo University High in the 880-yard relay with a clocking of 1:33.0.

OSU Gains Golf Crown

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP)—Ohio State swept to the Big Ten golf championship Saturday, burying runnerup Michigan by 22 strokes to clinch its first title since the days of Jack Nicklaus five years ago.

The Buckeyes finished 72 holes on the University of Iowa's South Finkbine course in 1,480 strokes. Michigan had 1,502, and defending champion Purdue placed seventh with 1,526.

John Seehausen of Northwestern won the individual crown with a two-over-par 286, five strokes better than Alex Antonio of Ohio State. Defending champion Bill Newton of Michigan finished third with 292.

Cranbrook Takes 'B' Track Title

EAST LANSING (AP)—Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook picked up important points with firsts in the 880-yard relay and 100-yard dash to win the Class B state high school track and field meet Saturday.

Ed Randle won the dash for Cranbrook with a time of :10.2, and was lead-off runner in the 880-yard relay, won in 1:31.0. Also running the relay for Cranbrook were Bruce Hunter, Warren Craig and Craig Tallberg.

Cranbrook won with 38 points. Ecorse was second in the Class B meet with 36 1/2 points, Dearborn Heights Riverside placed third with 28 points and Oxford was fourth with 22 points.

Three meet records were set, although the Class B preppers were competing in better than 70-degree heat on the Michigan State University track field.

Ron Strang of Detroit Lutheran won the mile run in 4:21.1, bettering the former B record of 4:22.3 by Eric Zempen of Howell, in 1962.

The winning pole vault height of 13 feet, 6 inches by Bill Bekkering of Fremont just topped the Class B former high of 13-5 1/2 by Ernest VanHage of Hudsonville Christian in 1964.

Dearborn Heights Riverside, winning the mile relay in 3:25.1, bettered the former B record of 3:26.3 by River Rouge in 1964.
