Soo's Dougherty Establishes New Pole Vault Mark

MARQUETTE — Coach Roy Kenyon, with a head of six feet, one ounce, set a new pole vault mark for the U. P. Track Championships in the pole vault event Saturday, establishing a new record of 10 feet 10 inches.

The victory was the first for Kenyon in the pole vault since 1954, when he set a record of 10 feet 6 inches while coaching at the University of Michigan.
