Indians, Pershing Top Qualifiers

Eastern and Pershing, figured to fight it out for the City League's East Side track championship, showed why in preliminaries Tuesday.

The Indians filled 11 qualifying positions, and Pershing was next with 10.

The Doughboys all but filled the 440-yard field, spotting in all four members of their mile-relay teams that set a state record in the Class A finals 10 days ago.

Pershing also got the best \$80-yard time from John Kitchen and had the broad jump leader in Dennis Baker.

Eastern's Henry Hill was the shot put leader, and James Hogan was quickest of 220-yard qualifiers at :23.0 and matched Pershing's Elliot Haskins at :10.2 in the 100.
