

# Michigammes Set Several Records

If other American cities show three new state records with the same progress in girls' track and field development as Ann Arbor, the Soviet Union's domination of Olympic women's track and field events may soon be at an end.

During the Memorial weekend the Michigammes, coached by Ken and Betty Simmons of Ann Arbor, easily won the AAU-sponsored Olympic development meet at Wisner stadium in Pontiac by a total of 43½ points.

Runner up to the Michigammes was the Motor City Track Club with 13½ points.

On their way to victory, the Ann Arbor and area group set

Louise Gerrish of Livonia also establishing a new American javelin mark with her distance of 160 feet 4½ inches. Miss Gerrish held the old record, 155 feet 6 inches, set a year ago.

Francie Kraker of Ann Arbor won the 1,500-meter run in 4:50.35, lowering her previous state record by .05 while Cindy Jones of Howell won both the shot put and discus.

Her shot put of 39 feet 41½ inches was a new state record, eclipsing her old mark of 36 feet 4 inches set in 1965, while Miss Jones' discus effort of 109 feet 11¼ inches easily erased the 1965 state record of Flint's Pauline Love, 92 feet 8½ inches.

Kathy Draggomer of Taylor won the 80-meter hurdles and the high jump while Vonnie Perrine of Whitmore Lake captured the 880-yard run in a fine girl's time of 2:22.4.

Ann Arbor's Janie Schultz placed second in the 1500-meter run and Grass Lake's Mary Hokanson was second in the 440-yard dash.
