

Modest Prep Ace Runs 4:17.7 Mile

"I'm not much of an athlete," says Ron Strang, a junior at Lutheran West High School.

Yet Ron ran one of the fastest miles in Michigan high school history Saturday night in the Schafer Invitational in 40-degree temperatures.

Strang was clocked in 4:17.7, a full five seconds under the state Class B record and only four seconds off Lou Scott's Class A mark set in 1963.

"The only reason I went out for track was because my two older brothers bugged me so long I couldn't refuse," Strang said.

"ONE OF MY brothers, Bill, held the school mile record of 4:49 but I've taken care of that."

Another excellent performance was the 7:58 mark set-by Riverside High in the two-mile relay. It marked the first time in Michigan school-boy history the two-mile relay had been run under eight minutes.

Fred Roll of East Detroit turned in a 13-feet, 71/4 inchpole vault and Bob Lynn of Inkster won both hurdles.

Wyandotte won the team title with 40 points with Inkster placing second with 38, Ecorse 29½, Romulus 25 and East Detroit 14. Ypsilanti High won the 10th
