### Marshall, Albion Also Win

# Sexton Trackmen Win Albion Relays

ALBION — The 26th Albion College Relays were held in ideal weather here yesterday with Lansing Sexton capturing Class I as 68 high school track teams competed in six class divisions of competition.

The Big Reds from Lansing took the class for the largest schools with 37 points followed by Ann Arbor at 34, Battle Creek Central with 27½, Kalamazoo Central 24, Royal Oak Kimball 21, Lansing Eastern 14, Lansing Everett 10½, Ferrisdale 9½, Jackson Central 9 and Kalamazoo Loy Norrix 7.

**880 Record Set**  
There were three double winners in Class I. Fred Carver of Kazoo Central won the high jump at six feet, two inches and the long jump at 22 feet, eight inches. Charles Davis of Sexton took the high hurdles in 14.3 seconds and the low barriers in 19.4 seconds. Jim Manuel of Sexton won the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds and the 220 in 22.3.

One record was set when Tom Allen of Lansing Eastern ran the 880 in 1:57.5 as the first under two minutes.

The Bearcats collected their points when Carl English took a third in the 220 and 100 and fourth in the shot put. Pete Jenney was fifth in the pole vault and Mike O'Connell fifth in the shot put. Frank Blake tied for fifth in the high jump while the 880 relay team finished fifth. Sylvester Malone was third in the mile and Larry Evans second in the high hurdles with Henry Braddock fifth. Braddock also took a fifth in the low hurdles and Eugene Brown was fifth in the 100.

**Cornwell Wins**  
Jackson Parkside romped off with the Class II title with 43 points. Battle Creek Lakeview finished with 11 points for ninth place.

Norm Cornwell won the 880-yard run for Lakeview in 2:08.1 while Jay Heinrich was second in the shot. Eric Dobbertein took the high hurdles in 14.3 seconds and the low barriers in 19.4 seconds. Marshall won the Class III crown with 49 points while Mount Clemens L'Anse Creuse, Hillsdale and Sturgis tied for second with 25 points each. Hastings collected eight points while Charlotte got five and Coldwater four.

John Schneider of Marshall won the 100-yard dash in 10.2 seconds and the 220 in 22.6. He also was fourth in the long jump. Jerry Thacker of Marshall won the shot put with a heave of 46 feet, 7¼ inches.

**Lone Repeater**  
Don Reed of Three Rivers set a class record in the mile at 4:31.35 and Sturgis won the mile relay in record time of 3:35.4.

Albion was the only school to repeat as champion winning Class IV after having won the Class B-I title last year. The Wildcats had 42½ points while Lansing Waverly had 30 and Penfield 24.

Chip VanSchoick led Albion's forces by taking the long jump at 20-11 and the 100-yard dash in 10.7 seconds. Dave Egnatuck took the 880 in 2:02.2. The Wildcat quartet of Scott Robinson, Willie Boggan, Mike Mathews and Egnatuck won the mile relay in 3:37.4. Albion also took three seconds.

Bob Pratt of Penfield won the 440-yard dash in 52.5 seconds while Dick Kellogg was second in the high hurdles and third in the high jump. The Penfield mile relay team was second.

**3 Terriers Set**  
Dexter won Class V with 22 points while Homer finished far down the list with nine points. Keith Warner won the 100-yard dash in 10.2 seconds.

New Haven dethroned Covert as Class VI champion getting 39 points to Covert's 33. Litchfield was next with 26½ while Tekonsha mustered one point and Slaters Commonwealth was blanked.

Gary Adams of Litchfield pole vaulted 11 feet, 8¼ inches for a new class record while Mike Bills of Litchfield won the 880 in 2:03.7 for a new standard and the Litchfield mile relay team won in 3:38.3 for a new mark.

Rick Chenaull of New Haven was the meet's only triple winner as he won the long jump in 21 feet, three-quarter inches, took the century in 10.6 seconds and the 220 in 23.3 seconds.
