

Records Rewritten By Michigammas

Ann Arbor Michigammas set three new Central States records, including a new national javelin mark, at the Central States AAU Track and Field Championships in Cleveland during the weekend.

Louise Gerrish set the new javelin mark with her distance of 163 feet 10 inches as the Ann Arbor team, coached by Ken and Betty Simmons, compiled a total of 68 points for third place.

Canada's Nancy McReady set a new mark with her 52-foot shot put. In addition to Miss McReady's effort in the shot, which also was a new Canadian

record, she set a new Central States discus mark of 152 feet.

Mamie Rawlings of the Chicago Youth Club set a new Central States record by lowering the old 80-meter hurdles mark of :11.5 by half a second.

Francie Kraker of Ann Arbor scored a pair of record finishes with her wins in the 440-yard dash and 1500-meter run. Her quarter-mile time of :56.9 lowered the former Central States mark, set by Olympian Sandra Knott of Cleveland, by four-tenths of a second while the 1500-meter clocking clipped two and six-tenths off the old mark of 4:45.6, also set by Sandra Knott.

Vonnie Perrine was second in the 880-yard run and fourth in the 1500-meter distance while Cindy Jones added field event points with her third in the shot and second in discus. Other Ann Arbor scorers were: Janie Schulte, fifth in the 1500 meters; Mary Hokanson, sixth in the 440-yard run; Kathy Dragomir, third in the high jump; and Pam Wilson, third in 80 meter hurdles.
