**Howell's Cindy Jones Tired but Successful**

Not even a coach could blame Cindy Jones for feeling tired at Waverly High School Saturday afternoon.

You would have been struck too if you had thrown the shot, discus and javelin 18 times in less than two hours.

Despite the heavy schedule, Cindy, an Eastern Michigan University sophomore from Howell, set a meet record and for one of the outstanding performances in track and field at the championships at the Michigan AAU.

Her performance helped the women's javelin team to win the team title for the first time with 251 points while defending champion Detroit Track Club finished second at 124. The best Lansing Lightnings were third at 21.

It was the highest mark from out in the meet's history. Fifteen teams, most of them from Detroit and its suburbs, entered 60 athletes in the event.

Team scoring took place only in the women's division (17 years old and above) while the men (14 to 23) competed for individual honors.

Miss Jones, who stands six feet, even and weighs 130 pounds, captured the track title for the third straight year with 25 points.

For effort, however, she was almost a foot below the record she set last year and about two feet short of the 17 she made with winning earlier in the season.

"I was pretty tired by the time the shot put rolled around," she explained. "I had to throw the javelin and discus first. It had a disappointing performance in the discus where she set a meet record of 104 feet, 1 1/2 inches, five feet beyond the mark she made last year.

Miss Jones, who threw 135 feet in the discus at Pontiac five weeks ago, for a state record, also was fourth in the javelin.

Ann Payne, Michigan State sophomore from Colon, Mich., led the rest with winning, taking the third in the shot and second in the discus although competing with an injured leg.

In the 100-meter dash, East Lansing High School sophomore Mary Butler had the top performance, taking second in 22 with a 28.8 performance.
