

Northern, Central Cop Triangular Track Tests

MIDLAND — Flint Northern's trackmen Thursday made significant progress by scoring 75 points to beat Midland (68½) and Saginaw Arthur Hill (4½) in a triangular meet.

It clearly was the Vikings' best performance of the spring. They won nine

of the 14 events, scoring heaviest in the long jump where William Wallace's 20-10¼ leap led a 1-2-3 finish for 10 points.

Wallace also won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and anchored the winning 880 relay team. Hurdler L. S. Nichols was a double victor.

SW Loses To Pontiac By One Point

News was both good and bad Thursday for Southwestern High's trackmen.

Although nipped by Pontiac Central, 65-64, in a triangular meet at the Colts' track, Coach Gordon Spencer got a big lift when Lavern Miller high jumped 6-3 and helped the winning mile relay team. It appears that Flint's most versatile trackman may be ready for more work in Saturday's city meet.

Bay City Central was a distant third with 19 points.

Pontiac gave Southwestern's field records a smashing.

Hurdler Bill Tipton won the highs in 14.2 seconds and the lows in a season-best 18.6 and pole vaulter Earl Polk cleared 13-11 to enter the record book.

Southwestern won only five events — Pontiac had seven and Bay City two — but had an eight-point lead until the Chiefs finished 1-2-4 in the pole vault to grab the victory.

The Indians won 10 of 14 events while scoring 79 points to Saginaw's 39 and Handy's 30.

Herb Washington coasted to times of 9.8 seconds in the 100-yard dash and 21.9 in the 220 for the only double triumph. He also anchored the winning 880 relay team.

The most significant perfor-

mance was Jim Morse's 9:39.9 time for two miles. State champion Jim Love ran the mile for the first time this spring, winning in 4:30.4.

Millington Prevails

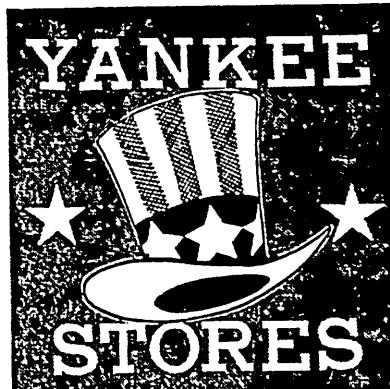
