

IOWA FALLS, IOWA - Flint Junior College today goes after its biggest baseball victory.

The Bears stand one victory away from a trip to the national tournament as they meet Ellsworth, Iowa, in the finals

Flint had to work overtime Friday before outlasting Wright JC of Chicago, 1-0, in 12 innings to reach the finals.. Ellsworth eliminated Willmar, Minn., 12-1.


