SAGINAW — Flint Southwestern's depth, plus 1-2-3 finishes in both hurdles, Tuesday led to an important victory over Midland and Saginaw High in a triangular track meet.

The Colts won only five events but collected six seconds while amassing 59½ points. Midland had 53 and Saginaw 35½.

Midland mustered only one second place after taking eight firsts. Saginaw helped Southwestern considerably by taking seven seconds.
