Charlie Robinson, Mackenzie High's barrel-chested sprinter, is ready to defend his state dash titles.

Robinson qualified for next Saturday's state championships at East Lansing by winning both the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes in Saturday's regionals at Henry Ford High.

He was clocked in :09.9 in the century and :21.8 in the 220.
