

Tipton Lives Up To Billing

EAST LANSING (AP) — Bill Tipton of Pontiac Central, called the classiest high school hurdler in the nation, justified the name Saturday by winning both the 120-yard high and 180-yard low hurdles in the Class A State High School Track and Field Championship Meet.

Tipton, who plans to go to Eastern Michigan, was the defending champion in both events. He previously had tied the American outdoor high school record of :13.5 in the Saginaw Valley Conference championships.

Tipton raced over the high hurdles in :13.9 bettering his former state record of 14-flat last year.

His winning time in the 180-yard low hurdles was :19.3, a

fraction above the Class A record of 19 flat by Warren Cawley of Farmington in 1958.

Despite the heroics by Tipton, Flint Central managed to place only second in the team scoring with 36 points. Battle Creek Central was the team winner with a high of 48 points, although it did not have a single win. Battle Creek won on team strength, managing to place several men in key events.

\$750,000 IN PURSES

Biggest Week At Tracks

The return to competition of Buckpasser, along with the Memorial Day holiday and the running of the Jersey Derby, the Belmont Stakes and the Californian make this week shape up as the biggest of the year in horse racing.

Value of the features races on Memorial Day and Saturday will total some \$750,000.

Buckpasser, the 1966 Horse of the Year, will go in the \$100,000-added Metropolitan mile at Aqueduct on Tuesday, the same day that Dr. Fager and In Reality hook up in the \$100,000-added Jersey Derby at Garden State Park.

Proud Clarion, the Kentucky Derby winner, and Damascus, the Preakness winner, will meet again in the 1½ miles of the \$125,000-added Belmont Stakes on Saturday at Aqueduct to complete the Triple Crown classics for 3-year-olds. The \$100,000-added Californian also will be run on Saturday at Hollywood Park in California.
