

# Three Track Titles for SOC

South Oakland boasts two state championship relay teams, one individual champ and nearly had another as the aftermath of state high school track meets Saturday.

Birmingham Seaholm brought home the mile relay title and Southfield's Kim Hartman the mile crown from the Class A meet at East Lansing.

Country Day captured the 880 relay crown in Class C at Central Michigan University, Mount Pleasant.

Royal Oak Dondero's Rich Eaton was barely nosed out in the 440 finals by Lorenzo Montgomery of Detroit Southeastern who set a quarter-mile record of 48.9.

Seaholm's title-winning mile

relay did 3:22.3 with Jim LaBelle (50.6), Bob Baxter (50.8), Neil Marzella (50.3) and Roger Holtz (49.8). All are juniors except LaBelle, a senior. It was a school record.

Class A team winner was Battle Creek Central (48), followed by Flint Central (36). Ypsilanti (23) placed third followed by Pontiac Central (22) and de-

fending champion Flint Southwestern (21). Seaholm tied for ninth at 15 points with Wyandotte. Royal Oak Dondero, Mackenzie and Mount Clemens each had 12 to share 11th place. RO Kimball had seven points (fourth in mile relay).

Seaholm nipped Detroit Pershing (3:22.6) by three-tenths of a second in winning the mile relay. Of the schools with the top six times in the state so far, four ran in Saturday's meet.

### Stayed Together—

Pershing's 3:21.6 set last year is the only time better than Seaholm's. Kimball did 3:24 in the finals.

Seaholm coach Kermit Ambrose said he had "definite ideas" early in the season about keeping the four together. The four have run as a unit except on a couple of occasions when sophomore Rick Brooker subbed. Marzella's foot bothered him but the MSU trainer had him in good shape for the race.

Other Seaholm points came from Holtz, eighth in the 440; Chuck Loiko, sixth in the shot put (55' 4"); and Chip Gorman, eighth in the two-mile.

### Hartman Wins Classic—

Hartman nipped defending champion Jim Love of Flint Central by inches in winning the mile in 4:18.2. The slender, 5' 10", 128-pound, 18-year-old senior was third going into the fourth and final lap. He took the lead entering the backstretch. Both collapsed at the finish.

The state title climaxed a brilliant prep career for Hartman who has won everything in sight on the local scene.

Last year he placed third in the state meet after a disqualification. He is an 'A' student and will attend Michigan State University.

### CD School Record—

Country Day's winning 880 relay was caught in a school record 1:33.8. It had John Means, Andy Ditzhazy, Jerry Dowis and Casey McWilliams. Country Day finished 14th in the meet, Laingsburg the winner.

Ditzhazy placed eighth in the 100 and Pete Risdon eighth in the 880. The mile relay was 10th in a school record 3:37.9.

## Klippstein, Wood Depart

DETROIT (UPI)—The Detroit Tigers, aiming at flexibility in their catching corps and strength in their bullpen, parted with veteran pitcher Johnny Klippstein and infielder Jake Wood in a roster shakeup Sunday.

General Manager Jim Campbell and Manager Mayo Smith decided to call up rookie pitchers Pat Dobson and Mike Marshall, along with recently acquired catcher Bill Heath, from Toledo of the International League.

Klippstein, age 39, who has been in the major leagues since 1950, was given an unconditional release. He had a 5.40 earned run average in five appearances this season after being signed as a free agent this spring.

Wood, who had been used primarily as a utility man in recent seasons, and rookie pitcher George Korince were optioned to Toledo subject to 24-hour recall. Wood was hitting .050 as a pinch hitter and Korince had a 5.14 ERA in nine appearances.

Dobson, age 25, has been a starter with Toledo, winning four and losing one and Marshall, 24, a reliever, has a 2-0 record with an 0.61 ERA.
