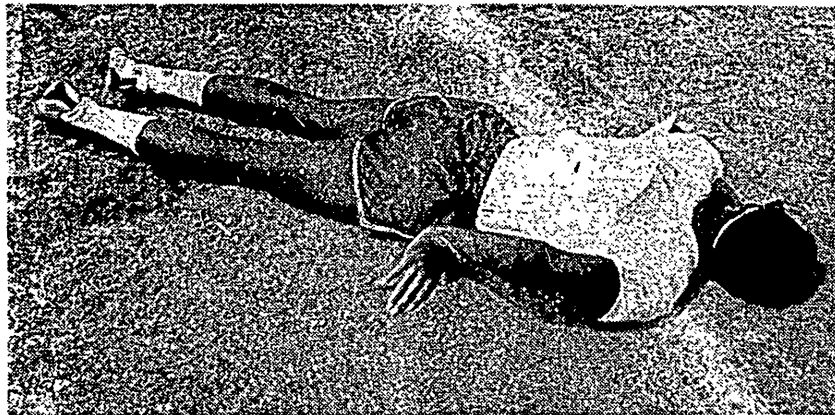




Jim Love Loses Mile in Final Yard
